**RECEIVER'S FIRST OMNIBUS OBJECTION TO CLAIMS
AND MOTION TO STRIKE CLAIMS**

Receiver, Michael I. Goldberg (the "Receiver"), pursuant to Rule 4 of the Complex Business Litigation Rules, files this First Omnibus Objection to Claims and Motion to Strike Claims, as listed on the attached exhibits, and states as follows:

Preliminary Statement

Importantly, this Objection and Motion to Strike only seeks to strike claims made by individuals who the Receiver believes, based on all available evidence, have no connection whatsoever to the collapse of the Champlain Tower South Condominium (the "CTS Collapse"). The Receiver believes that these "Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants" submitted fraudulent claims seeking to wrongfully capitalize on this tragedy at the expense of the true victims. The Receiver believes that the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants, most of whom reside outside of the jurisdiction of the Court (and mostly reside in states in the western part of the United States), disregarded the fact that they signed their claims under penalty of perjury in an attempt to defraud the victims of the tragedy – and, indeed, the Court. It is believed that many of the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants learned about the Settlement Fund and the concomitant claims process through a website called "Hustlermoneyblog.com" (or similar websites), a website which provides

unprincipled individuals with a list of “No-proof class actions” whereby they can obtain settlement funds without having to supply evidence in support of their claims.

By filing claims and seeking recovery from the Settlement Fund, the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants have submitted themselves to the jurisdiction of the Court. The Receiver believes that all Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants should be required to physically appear in Court (and not via Zoom), be sworn in to testify under penalty of perjury, and required to present competent evidence in support of their claims. Cross-examination by the Receiver and, in the Court’s discretion, direct questioning from the Court regarding their claims should be permitted. Of course, in the event the Court determines that any prosecuted claims are fraudulent and perjury was committed, the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants will have subjected themselves to potentially severe consequences.

Accordingly, the Receiver requests the Court set a hearing in which Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants are provided notice and an opportunity to come before the Court and present evidence in support of their claims, but with the understanding that doing so will be a testimonial proceeding under penalty of perjury. In the event a Presumptively Fraudulent Claimant fails to appear before the Court or fails to present competent evidence in support of a claim, the Receiver requests the Court to strike and otherwise disallow all such claims.

Background

1. This case arises out of the tragic collapse of the Champlain Towers South Condominium (the “Condominium”) on June 24, 2021.

2. Through the oversight of the Court and the team work of the Receiver, the Mediator, and the unbelievably talented team of Plaintiffs’ lawyers, a settlement fund of approximately \$1.1 billion (the “Settlement Fund”) has been amassed for the benefit of the true victims of this tragedy.

3. On May 27, 2022, the Court entered an order setting a deadline of July 18, 2022, for victims of the tragedy to file claims with the Receiver in order to be eligible to compensation from the Settlement Fund. In accordance with that order, numerous legitimate victims timely filed claims. Unfortunately, it appears that numerous deceitful individuals unaffected by the CTS Collapse also filed claims in a fraudulent attempt to capitalize on the tragedy.

4. The Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants who filed the apparent fraudulent claims all claim to have been present in or at the building at the time of the CTS Collapse. However, a search of records compiled immediately after the CTS Collapse by governmental agencies and first responders, along with information obtained from known survivors, belie the assertions made by the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants in their claims. Other objective inconsistencies in the claims themselves indicate that the claims are fraudulent. By way of example, many of the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants (i) assert that they were in units at the time of the CTS Collapse that were completely destroyed in the collapse where no one survived; (ii) assert they were in units at the time of the CTS Collapse even though other survivors in those units have informed the Receiver that they don't know the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimant in question; and/or (iii) assert that they were in units that never existed. None of the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants is the record title owner to any condominium unit or known by any of the survivors of the units they claim to have been visiting at the time of the CTS Collapse.

5. Curiously, many (but not all) of these apparent fraudulent claims have one thing in common: they appear to be made by claimants who currently reside in a state in the western United States (e.g., California, Oregon, Washington, or Colorado). The Receiver believes many of the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants learned about the Settlement Fund and the concomitant claims process through a website called "hustlermoneyblog.com" – a website that alerts individuals of class action settlements where "no-proof" is required to support a claim. In fact, a

copy of the claim forms approved by the Court can be downloaded directly from the “hustlermoneyblog” website.

6. The Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants’ claims fall into different categories. The Court approved the following categories of claims: Personal Injury Simple (\$50,000); Personal Injury Full (damages set by the Court); Personal Property Contents Full (damages set by the Court); Personal Property Simple (\$50,000 or \$10,000); Wrongful Death Full (damages set by the Court); and Wrongful Death Liquidated (\$1 million). The Receiver received a total of 740 such claims, broken down into the following categories and with the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants claims separately indicated:

7. As shown in the chart, the Receiver received 461 Personal Injury Simple claims each seeking \$50,000. Of that number, the Receiver believes 389 Personal Injury Simple claims were filed by individuals with no connection to the CTS Collapse and therefore should be disallowed. The 389 Personal Injury Simple Claims which the Receiver believes to be fraudulent and should be stricken and disallowed are set forth on **Exhibit “A”** attached hereto.

¹ In addition to the 40 such claims listed in the chart, five additional subrogation claimants used the Personal Property Contents Full claim form to assert subrogation claims. Those claims will be addressed in a separate filing.

² In addition to the 65 such claims listed in the chart, one claimant used the Personal Property Contents Simple claim form to assert a personal property claim in addition to filing a Personal Injury Full claim form. That overlap will be addressed separately.

8. As also shown in the chart, the Receiver received 71 Personal Injury Full claims. Of that number, the Receiver believes 13 Personal Injury Full claims were filed by individuals with no connection to the CTS Collapse and therefore should be disallowed. The 13 Personal Injury Full claims which the Receiver believes to be fraudulent and should be stricken and disallowed are set forth on **Exhibit “B”** attached hereto.

9. As also shown in the chart, the Receiver received 40 Personal Property Contents Full claims. Of that number, the Receiver believes 26 Personal Property Contents Full claims were filed by individuals with no connection to the CTS Collapse and therefore should be disallowed. The 26 Personal Property Contents Full claims which the Receiver believes to be fraudulent and should be stricken and disallowed are set forth on **Exhibit “C”** attached hereto.

10. As also shown in the chart, the Receiver received 65 Personal Property Contents Simple claims. Of that number, the Receiver believes 24 Personal Property Contents Simple claims were filed by individuals with no connection to the CTS Collapse and therefore should be disallowed. The 24 Personal Property Contents Simple claims which the Receiver believes to be fraudulent and should be stricken and disallowed are set forth on **Exhibit “D”** attached hereto.

11. Finally, as shown in the chart, the Receiver received 104 Wrongful Death claims. Of that number, 79 claimants requested a hearing for the Court to consider and determine damages and the Court is currently conducting those hearings. Nineteen additional claimants known to be victims of the CTS Collapse “checked the box,” choosing to have their damages liquidated at \$1 million. Six Presumptively Fraudulently Claimants who the Receiver believes are not in any way victims of the CTS Collapse also submitted Wrongful Death Claim forms, each seeking \$1 million in liquidated damages. The Wrongful Death claims the Receiver believes to be fraudulent and should be stricken and disallowed are attached hereto as **Exhibit “E”**.

12. While it is certainly possible the Receiver has mistakenly included a legitimate claimant as a Presumptively Fraudulent Claimant identified on Exhibits A-E, his conclusion is based upon his and his team's analysis of records compiled by first responders, governmental entities, and the Receiver's own records assembled in the course of this Receivership. Accordingly, the Receiver believes his conclusions and the Exhibits attached hereto are accurate and well founded.

13. The Receiver believes that the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants do not possess valid claims and disregarded the fact that they were executing their claim forms "under the penalty of perjury." Therefore, the Receiver respectfully requests that the Court provide the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants.

Legal Argument

The Settlement Agreement approved by the Court governs the claims procedure in this matter. Section 5.2 of the Settlement Agreement provides that "[a] Settlement Class Member will be entitled to a Monetary Award as set forth in this Settlement Agreement and the Claims Administration Process if (a) such Settlement Class Member timely submits a Claim Form in accordance with the Claims Administration Process and this Settlement Agreement, and (b) the Claims Administrators determine that the Settlement Class Member is eligible for a Monetary Award in accordance with the Claims Administration Process and this Settlement Agreement." Thus, based on this language, a claimant must be a "Settlement Class Member" in order to qualify for a Monetary Award.³

³ Section 2.1.91 states "Monetary Award" means an award for the payment of money from the Settlement Fund to a Settlement Class Member as set forth in this Settlement Agreement and pursuant to the Claims Administration Process.

Section 1.1.1 of the Settlement Agreement states “Settlement Class” means all (a) Unit Owners, (b) Invitees, (c) Residents, (d) persons who died or sustained any personal injury (including, without limitation, emotional distress) *as a result of the CTS Collapse*, (e) persons or entities who suffered a loss of, or damage to, real property or personal property, or suffered other economic loss, *as a result of the CTS Collapse*, (f) Representative Claimants, and (g) Derivative Claimants (emphasis added). Accordingly, there is a causation requirement that the claimant have incurred damage “as a result of the CTS Collapse” to be eligible for a Monetary Award

Based on a review of all available evidence, the Receiver believes that none of the claimants listed in the attached exhibits was present at the Condominium at the time of the CTS Collapse or otherwise qualifies to be a member of the Settlement Class. Importantly, section 20.14 of the Settlement Agreement specifically places the burden of proof on a claimant to prove that the claimant is entitled to a Monetary Award: “Unless explicitly provided otherwise, whenever a showing is required to be made in this Settlement Agreement, the Party seeking the relief shall bear the burden of substantiation.” Accordingly, the Court should enter an order requiring the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants to appear before the Court and meet their burden of proof by present competent evidence that they sustained economic loss “as a result of the CTS Collapse” – absent which, the Court should these claims.

Not only does the process the Receiver recommends comport with the Settlement Agreement, but it also satisfies the claims process requirements in equity receiverships.⁴ More specifically, in an equity receivership, “[i]t is the court itself which has the care of the property in dispute ... [and the] receiver is but the creature of the court.” *S.E.C. v. Safety Finance Service, Inc.*,

⁴ Although the case law the Receiver cites is federal, the Receiver believes it is highly instructive and relevant in this state court receivership proceeding.

674 F. 2d 368, 373 (5th Cir. 1982).⁵ It has further been observed that “[i]n accepting or rejecting the claims of creditors, as well as in filing a report of findings of fact and conclusions of law, a receiver acts like a master ... [and] a district court must decide de novo all objections to findings of fact and conclusions of law made or recommended by a master before ruling on the master’s recommendations.” *U.S. v. Fairway Capital Corp.*, 433 F. Supp. 2d 226, 231 (D.R.I. 2006) (citations omitted). Moreover, guidance from a court based on the facts and circumstances of a particular case can be especially helpful because “case law involving district court administration of an equity receivership (once the receivership is underway) is sparse and is usually limited to the facts of the particular case.” *S.E.C. v. Hardy*, 803 F. 2d 1034, 1037 (9th Cir. 1986).

One principle that has been consistently recognized is that the courts generally have broad powers and wide discretion to determine relief in equity receiverships. *See, e.g., S.E.C. v. Capital Consultants LLC*, 397 F. 3d 733, 738 (9th Cir. 2005); *S.E.C. v. Basic Energy & Affiliated Resources Inc.*, 273 F. 3d 657, 668 (6th Cir. 2001); *S.E.C. v. Elliott*, 953 F.2d 1560, 1566 (11th Cir. 1992), *rev’d in part on other grounds*, 998 F. 2d 922 (11th Cir. 1993). The basis for this broad deference to a court’s supervisory role in equity receiverships arises out of the fact that most receiverships involve multiple parties and complex transactions. *See Capital Consultants*, 397 F. 3d at 738; *see also Hardy*, 803 F. 2d at 1037 (because a district judge supervising an equity receivership faces a myriad of complicated problems in dealing with the various parties and issues involved in administering the receivership, reasonable administrative procedures, crafted to deal with the complex circumstances of each case, will be upheld). Accordingly, a court’s decisions relating to the choice of a distribution plan for the receivership will be reviewed for abuse of

⁵ Although the funds in this case are primarily being distributed through the class action proceeding which are governed by the Settlement Agreement, the Receiver believes it is necessary to include an analysis of receivership case law as well, as the class action is encompassed within the Receivership.

discretion. *See S.E.C. v. Credit Bancorp Ltd.*, 290 F. 3d 80, 87 (2d Cir. 2002); *Elliott*, 953 F.2d at 1569-70; *Hardy*, 803 F. 2d at 1037-8.

Whatever remedy a court ultimately chooses as an equitable distribution plan must take into consideration the due process rights of claimants. In general, claimants may have some due process rights in the distribution plan of a receivership, although there are no specific standards or rules setting forth precisely what rights such investors would have to participate in such a proceeding. *See S.E.C. v. TLC Investments and Trade Co.*, 147 F. Supp. 2d 1031, 1034 (C.D. Cal. 2001). In the context of the formulation of an equitable distribution plan, due process requires notice and an opportunity to be heard. *See generally Elliott*, 953 F.2d at 1566.

The use of summary proceedings, such as the proceedings recommended by the Receiver herein, is permissible in the formulation and implementation of a distribution plan so long as those affected are afforded adequate notice and an opportunity to be heard. *See S.E.C v. Credit Bancorp*, 124 F. Supp. 2d 824, 828 (S.D.N.Y. 2000) (“[i]ncluded within the court’s powers in administering the receivership estate and fashioning appropriate equitable relief is the discretion to use summary proceedings, so long as those affected are afforded adequate notice and an opportunity to be heard”); *Elliott*, 953 F.2d at 1566-1567 (in granting relief, it is appropriate for the court to use summary proceedings so long as the parties are provided with notice and an opportunity to be heard when the facts are in dispute); *Hardy*, 803 F. 2d at 1040 (approval of the claims procedures used in a receivership case when all claimants were given reasonable notice and opportunities to be heard at hearings). Summary proceedings are not only permissible in this context, but may actually be preferable, because the use of such proceedings reduces the time necessary to settle disputes, decreases litigation costs, and prevents further dissipation of the receivership assets. *See Elliott*, 953 F.2d at 1566; *S.E.C v. Wencke*, 783 F. 2d 829, 837 (9th Cir. 1986). “Indeed, summary proceedings have the salutary effect ... of preventing further dissipation of the receivership assets

through unnecessary litigation costs and promoting judicial efficiency.” *Credit Bancorp*, 124 F. Supp. 2d at 828. Pursuant to these principles, the *Elliott* court required claimants that objected to the use of summary proceedings to show “how they would have been better able to defend their interests in a plenary proceeding.” 953 F.2d at 1567.

Consistent with the foregoing authority, the Receiver hereby requests that the Court adopt the procedures proposed above to address the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants’ claims, as it provides sufficient due process to the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants.

WHEREFORE, the Receiver respectfully requests the Court to enter an order (i) requiring the Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants to physically appear before the Court on a specified date; (ii) be sworn in to testify under penalty of perjury; (iii) present required to present competent evidence in support of their claims and submit themselves to cross examination by the Receiver and, as in the Court’s discretion, direct questioning by the Court; failing which, the Receiver respectfully requests that the Court (iv) strike and otherwise disallow the claims of those Presumptively Fraudulent Claimants who fail to appear at such hearing or fail to provide competent evidence in support of their claims. The Receiver further requests that the Court (v) grant such other relief as is just and proper.
